It was lovely to see parents/ carers attend our Sleep workshop for children as part of our mental health offering of support. Following our successful time as a Thrive Ambassador school of Excellence, St Andrew's now continues our journey with Nurture UK.

Free Schools Meals (FSM) and Pupil Premium extra Funding for your child and school

As you are probably aware, all pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a free **hot** school lunch. This initiative was introduced by the Government in 2014 and aims to ensure that all children can benefit from a hot meal at lunchtime. However, it is important to still **register** for free school meals because of your **income or personal circumstances.** Children may be eligible for a free school meal on this basis, if parents are in receipt of one or more of these benefits:

- Income support
- Child tax credit (provided your annual income does not exceed £16,190)
- Income based Job seeker's allowance
- Income related Employment support allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

Even if you feel that your child wouldn't want to take up a free school meal, applying is also important because FSM is linked to registering for Pupil Premium funding. Pupil Premium funding goes directly to the school and pays for things like a child's school trip, clubs, milk or additional teachers and Learning Partners to provide extra support. The Pupil Premium is extra funding for every child who's eligible for free school meals throughout their time at school.

With the rising cost of living, we are asking all parents to consider if their child can get free schools meals and to register for Pupil Premium funding. If you believe that you are entitled to claim for a free school meal because you are in receipt of one or more of the above benefits, it is beneficial that you still apply for this benefit. From now (January 2024) the North Somerset application system is changing to a new Free School Meals system. This means parents will be able to apply through the same Citizen's Portal that they apply for school places. This means schools will no longer be able to apply for free school meals on parents' behalf. To apply please use the following link: www.n-somerset.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals.



Who: Mrs Arney


What: The Firework Maker's Daughter by Phillip Pullman
