Attendance letters

Good attendance is a school and national priority. As part of the school and Lighthouse (MAT) commitment to supporting all pupils to attend regularly, we closely monitor attendance and follow an attendance policy.

Some families will have received a letter if their child's overall attendance was 90% or less (considered to be persistent absence) or if their child had missed 6 or more sessions, since the start of the school year. **In the majority of cases, these letters are simply to keep you informed about your child's overall attendance and are nothing to worry about.** We recognise that a few days of illness in the first term, will have a more significant impact on overall attendance in the early part of the year. We will monitor attendance again at the next review point. If we are concerned about a child's attendance, in the interim, we will be in touch with you directly.

Helping your child with reading at home information session

I will be running 2 more sessions for parents to share ideas and tips for supporting your child with reading at home. Reading is a **vital** life skill which impacts future success and it is so important that we work in partnership to support your child to reach their potential. I will share how reading is taught, strategies for helping your child to read and there will also be an opportunity to ask questions. The sessions are on:

An event of this size does not run itself. We would appreciate volunteers to give some of their time on the day to help it to run smoothly.



NON - UNIFORM DAY - Wednesday 20th December


