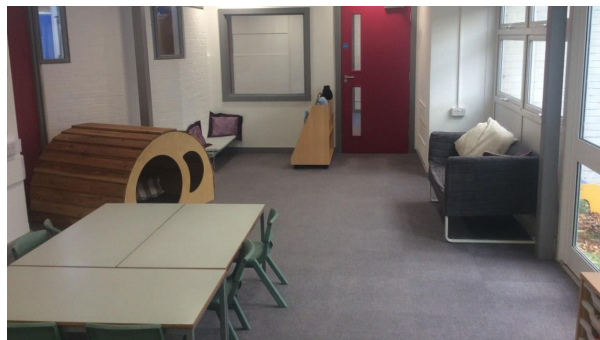


A very warm welcome back to all our children, families and staff as we begin another exciting year at St Andrew's primary. We hope that you all enjoyed a wonderful summer break together as families.

Attendance and Punctuality

Good attendance and punctuality make a huge difference to children's success in school. Every lesson counts and children who attend regularly and arrive on time are better able to

build strong relationships be confident and make the most of what school has to offer. Establishing positive routines every morning supports children to feel regulated and supports their wellbeing. Being late to school does affect how a child can settle as walking into a class where learning is already happening is not ideal for them.

As a gentle reminder, the official school day begins at 8:45 and this is when registers will be open. All children are expected to arrive promptly for the registration period. There is a 10 minute registration window which closes at 8:55am. The school gate will open at 8:40 and the front gate will shut at 8:55. Any pupils entering once the gates are shut will need to enter school via the office.

Pupils arriving after 9:00am will be marked as late. If a child arrives after 9:10 they will be marked as unauthorised.

Privacy Notice and Data Protection Policy

Under data protection law, individuals have a right to be informed about how the school uses any personal data that we hold about them. We comply with this right by providing

'privacy notices' to individuals where we are processing their personal data. Privacy notices have been circulated to all parents previously but please remember if you would ever like a copy then either call into the school office or refer to the information within the Policies section on the school website. This privacy notice explains how we collect, store and use personal data about pupils. Please also refer to school website to read all our policies including Data Protection Policy.

Walking home from school

It is school policy that only children in Year 5 and 6 can walk home on their own if we have parent's permission in writing. If you provided us with such a permission last year, we assume that you are still happy for your child to walk home on their own this year. Please let the office know if anything has changed.

Medical Matters

If your child requires medication in school at any time please ask for a 'Request for School to Administer Medication' form to be sent home/emailed from the office. Any medicine will need to be handed into the office. We cannot administer medicine without having received this form. Please can any medical or dental appointments be made after school or during the school holidays. We do appreciate that this is not always possible, especially with hospital appointments.

Inhalers

Please can we gently remind you that it is the parent's responsibility to check that any inhalers held in school are in date. All inhalers sent in to school must be in their original box and clearly labelled with the dosage. Thank you.

Break time snacks

Please can we remind parents that children should only be bringing in a piece of fresh fruit or some dried fruit for their break time snack. Cereal bars, fruit bars (including fruit winders) or fruit covered in yoghurt etc. are not allowed.

Transfer to Secondary School in September 2027

Children in current Year 6 are due to transfer to secondary school to Year 7 in September 2027. If your child is due to transfer to secondary school, you will need to apply for a school place.

Applications for secondary school places open on **12 September 2026**.

The closing date for applications is 11.59pm on **31 October 2026**.

We strongly recommend that you apply by the closing date. Applications received after this date may be treated as late and could affect the schools that can be considered for your child.

We recommend that you read our Parent Guide before making your application. The guide contains important information about the application process, how school places are allocated and how to make sure your preferences are considered correctly. You can apply online using the 'Apply for a school place online' link on our website: [Submit your application for a school place | North Somerset Council](#)

If you have previously registered for our online service, you can log in using your existing email address and password. If you have not used the service before, you can create a new account.

Before submitting your application, please check that the information held under 'My Account' is correct and up to date. In particular, please make sure your contact details and address are correct, as this information may be important when your application is considered.

Once you have submitted your online application, you will receive an email confirming that your application has been received.

If you are unable to apply online, you can submit a paper application form. This is available from the same webpage.

You can name up to three preferred schools on your application. We recommend that you use all three preferences. Listing three schools does not reduce your chance of being offered your first preference. It simply gives you the opportunity to express your preferences for more than one school.

Please consider your preferences carefully and make sure you understand the admission arrangements for each school you name.

Free School Meals - Important Reminder on the Application Process

Free School Meals - Important Reminder on the Application Process

Dear Parents and Carers,

As you may be aware there are a number of changes to Free School Meals eligibility from the start of this academic year:

- Eligibility is being expanded for all children and young people who are in households in receipt of Universal Credit.
- Transitional protection ended at the end of July 2026 (Transactional protection had been in place since April 2018 and meant that pupils becoming eligible for free meals under the benefits-based criteria retained their entitlement for 6 years, even if their household circumstances changed).

If your child(ren) already receive(s) free school meals:

As a result of these changes all pupils currently in receipt of free school meals will need to reapply for Free School Meals to take advantage of this benefit in the current academic year.

Free School Meals provide eligible pupils with a free school lunch during the school day. Registering for Free School Meals may also bring additional funding into school through pupil premium.

Changes to FSM eligibility from September 2026

Free School Meals Expansion and Changes from September 2026 As you are probably aware, all pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a free hot school lunch. This initiative was introduced by the Government in 2014 and aims to ensure that all children can benefit from a hot meal at lunchtime. Additionally, your child might be eligible for Free School Meals programme based on your income or personal circumstances. Children may be eligible for a free school meal on this basis, if parents are in receipt of one or more of the below benefits.

The income threshold to qualify is that of £7,400:

- Income support
- Child tax credit
- Working Tax Credit
- Income based Job seeker's allowance or Employment and Support Allowance
- Income related Employment support allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

It has recently been announced that FSM programme is going to expand as of September 2026 to include families receiving Universal Credit, who will be able to access free school meals. If your child is joining Reception class in September 2026 and you believe that you are entitled to claim for a free school meal because you are in receipt of one or more of the above benefits, or you are receiving Universal Credit it is essential that you apply for the FSM

benefit (even though all pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are already entitled to a free school lunch). This also applies to families who receive Universal Credit and whose children are already attending school. This is important because Pupil Premium funding to schools is relevant to the number of pupils who are entitled to receive free school meals. If parents who receive such benefits do not apply for free school meals, then the school will not receive the maximum funding to re-invest into the education of your child. Additionally, if you are not currently entitled but your circumstances change, it is really important that you still submit an application. Please call into the office and speak to one of the team, who will be pleased to help you with any questions you may have.

The second big change is that the transitional protection policy will no longer apply to children entitled to Free School Meals and it will terminate at the end of the 2025-26 academic year. This means that the eligibility for FSM will only be granted for one academic year at a time.

Re-checks for each child will be required every year going forward. All existing pupils in receipt of free school meals will need to have their entitlement re-checked before the start of September 2026, over the summer break. Anyone who was awarded FSMs over 2 years ago would have applied via an old system. These parents/carers, as well as parents of the children joining Reception in September 2026 will need to apply/reapply via their North Somerset Citizen's account (which is the same as the one used for School Admissions applications), before September 2026, but not sooner than from the beginning of August. Unfortunately, North Somerset Council have advised that the schools cannot apply on parents' behalf, however, we are happy to guide you through the process and help wherever we can.

FREE SCHOOL MEAL EXPANSION

More families may be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) from September 2026, when families receiving Universal Credit will be able to access free school meals. There will be two types of Free School Meal eligibility from September 2026:



TARGETED FSM
Continues to be based on the existing £7,400 income threshold.



EXPANDED FSM (NEW)
Applies to meals only. Covers pupils whose households are in receipt of Universal Credit



IMPORTANT: While eligibility to Expanded FSM will be automatically granted to all recipients of Universal Credit, families will still need to apply to receive this benefit.

RECHECKS FOR ALL PUPILS CURRENTLY IN RECEIPT OF FSM

Since 2018, there has been a Free School Meal transitional protection policy to ensure that children didn't lose their free school meals if their family's income increased. This meant that free school meals entitlement has been typically looked in until the end of the child's current phase of education (e.g. end of primary or secondary school).

This protection is ending at the end of the 2025-26 academic year.

This means that all existing pupils in receipt of free school meals will need to have their entitlement rechecked before the start of September 2026. If your family's earnings exceed the FSM threshold, your child(ren) will lose their eligibility and pay for school meals from September 2026.



In most cases, these rechecks will be automatic and no action will be required by parents



NORTH SOMERSET SCHOOLS ONLY

Anyone who was awarded FSMs over 2 years ago would have applied via an old system. These parents/carers will need to reapply via their North Somerset Citizen's account.



ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR SCHOOLS THAT BENEFITS PUPILS

Pupil Premium is extra funding given to schools for every child whose family is entitled for Targeted Free School Meals. This money makes a big difference to schools and the eligible pupils. It is often used for extra resources, school trips and additional staff.

Pupil Premium will continue to be paid to schools for those pupils who have been covered by the transitional protection arrangements outlined above.

1 CHECK IF YOU COULD BE ELIGIBLE

From September 2026, more families may be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM):

- TARGETED FSM - based on low household income (see benefits listed below)
- EXPANDED FSM - if you receive Universal Credit, you may be eligible



MY CHILD IS IN RECEPTION OR KS1 - DO I STILL NEED TO APPLY?

Yes, children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 receive Universal Infant Free School Meals automatically. However, registering for Free School Meals may provide access to additional funding and support for the school and your child.



YOU COULD BE ELIGIBLE FOR FSM IF:

1. Your household receives Universal Credit
- OR
2. You receive any of the following benefits:
 - Income support
 - Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Employment and Support Allowance
 - support under Part VI of the Immigration & Asylum Act*
 - Child Tax Credit*
 - Working Tax Credit*
